

THE HUNDRED TEAM TROPHY NAMING COMPETITION T&Cs

COMPETITION OVERVIEW

1. This is a promotion organised and run by the England and Wales Cricket Board Limited (company number 03251364) whose registered office is at Lords Cricket Ground, St Johns Wood, London, NW8 8QZ (the “**ECB**”). The ECB is operating a competition for fans of cricket and The Hundred to have the opportunity to name the new team competition trophy being introduced from this summer’s season of The Hundred (where the men’s and women’s competition tables will be combined and aggregated to declare the overall winning team) (the “**Trophy**”) for a chance to win match tickets to The Hundred 2026 Finals, together with a photo opportunity with the Trophy (the “**Competition**”).
2. Entrants to the Competition (“**Entrants**”) are automatically deemed to have accepted, and agreed to be bound by, these terms and conditions (the “**T&Cs**”) upon entry into the Competition.

ENTRY PROCESS

3. The Competition will be open for entry between 09:00 BST on 1 June 2026 and 00:00 BST on 15 June 2026 (the “**Closing Date**”). Any entries submitted after the Closing Date and/or other than in accordance with the entry requirements set out below in these T&Cs will be automatically disqualified from the Competition.
4. To enter the Competition, Entrants will be able to enter via one of the three (3) routes set out below:
 - a. **Route 1 – Entry Form shared by the ECB over email marketing communications in respect of The Hundred:** between the Opening Date and Closing Date, individuals who are subscribed to receive email marketing communications from the ECB in respect of The Hundred will receive a hyperlink to “*The Hundred Team Competition – Submit Your Suggestions For the Trophy Name*” entry form (the “**Entry Form**”);
 - b. **Route 2 – Entry Form made available via The Hundred social media channels:** between the Opening Date and Closing Date, there will be a hyperlink to the Entry Form on advertising posts made available by the ECB via the following official social media channels of The Hundred: Instagram and Facebook. There may also be hyperlinks to the Entry Form on advertising posts made available by influencers, who will be working together with the ECB in respect of the new Trophy being introduced, on their respective social media channels; or
 - c. **Route 3 – Entry Form made available on an article on The Hundred website:** between the Opening Date and Closing Date, the ECB will post an article on The Hundred website at <https://www.thehundred.com/news>, which will contain a hyperlink to the Entry Form.
5. To validly submit entry to the Competition, each Entrant must provide all mandatory details set out on the Entry Form, which shall be as follows:
 - a. one (1) suggested name for the Trophy, which must: (i) not contain any offensive, obscene, unlawful, hateful, inappropriate or otherwise objectionable terms or language; (ii) not contain any references to third parties (including names of any players, teams or brands); and (iii) in the reasonable opinion of the ECB, be a reasonable suggestion for a major sporting event trophy name (together, the “**Criteria**”);
 - b. full name of the Entrant;

- c. date of birth of the Entrant; and
- d. email address of the Entrant.

If the Entrant is between the ages of 13 and 17, they must obtain permission from their parent or guardian, who must also provide their details (name, date of birth and email address) on the Entry Form in order for the Entrant to validly submit their entry to the Competition. Entries will not be accepted by any other means.

6. Subject to the occurrence of the circumstance set out in clause 7, once all Entry Forms have been received and collected by the ECB by the Closing Date, the ECB will list all Trophy names suggested by Entrants (excluding any which are deemed, at the ECB's sole discretion, to not satisfy the Criteria) at <https://www.thehundred.com/news/4507328>. From such list, the Managing Director, Head of Audiences, Senior Brand Manager, Senior Marketing Manager and the Digital Manager of The Hundred Marketing team at the ECB, together with one (1) independent judge, will create a shortlist of five (5) suggested names for the Trophy, which will be shared with each of the sixteen (16) captains of the men's and women's teams of The Hundred (the "**Captains**"). The Captains will then carry out a vote to select the final name for the Trophy by 22 June 2026. If the vote carried out by the Captains results in a tie between two or more suggested names, the ECB will then select the final Trophy name via a computer-generated random draw on or soon after 22 June 2026. The Entrant who originally submitted the final name for the Trophy selected by the Captains will be declared as the winner of the Competition (the "**Winner**"). If, however, the same final name for the Trophy selected by the Captains was submitted by more than one Entrant, the ECB will select one (1) Winner via a computer-generated random draw on or soon after 22 June 2026.
7. Following the Closing Date, if the ECB in its reasonable opinion fails to receive any submissions for the Trophy name from its pool of Entrants that satisfy the Criteria, the ECB shall select the name for the Trophy internally and select a Winner from the pool of Entrants via a computer-generated random draw on or soon after 22 June 2026.
8. The Competition is free to enter, and no purchase will be necessary.

ELIGIBILITY

9. The Competition is only open to residents in the UK aged 13 years or older at the time of entry to the Competition, but excluding employees of the ECB, its associated companies and agencies, their immediate families or anyone else involved in the organisation or administration of the Competition. If the Entrant is below the age of 18 at the time of entry to the Competition, they must obtain permission from their parent or guardian, who must also provide their relevant details in the Entry Form to submit entry to the Competition. Such permissions obtained from the relevant parent or guardian shall include confirmation that the parent or guardian agrees to the Entrant's entry to the Competition, that they agree to the Prize being awarded to the Entrant and that they will accompany the Entrant during any travel in connection with the Prize winnings.
10. Each Entrant may only enter the Competition once. If the same Entrant submits multiple entries or the ECB discovers that an Entrant has entered the Competition on someone else's behalf (excluding in the case of a parent or guardian), then the ECB may, at its absolute sole discretion, limit such entries to a single entry only or disqualify that Entrant from the Competition.

11. In entering the Competition, each Entrant confirms that they are eligible to do so and eligible to claim the Prize (as defined below) that they may win. The ECB may require an Entrant to provide proof that they are eligible to enter the Competition (including proof of age or residence).
12. The ECB reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify any Entrant if it has reasonable grounds to believe that the Entrant has breached these T&Cs.

PRIZE

13. There will be one (1) winner of the Competition, who shall be awarded with one prize in total which shall be: (i) a pair of tickets (i.e. two (2) tickets) to The Hundred 2026 Finals Day on Sunday 16 August 2026 at Lord's Cricket Ground, London (14:15 BST for the women's final and 18:00 for the men's final); and (ii) an opportunity to take a photograph with the Trophy either pitch-side or on the pitch (to be determined by the ECB) at Lord's Cricket Ground on day of The Hundred 2026 Finals (the "**Prize**").
14. Only the Winner will be contacted (or, as relevant, their parent or guardian) as soon as reasonably practicable after the completion of the Competition via the email address submitted on the Entry Form.
15. The Winner (or their parent or guardian) must confirm that they are able to accept the Prize within 48 hours of being notified by the ECB that they are a Winner. In the event that any Winner fails to confirm their acceptance of the Prize by this date, or is unable to accept the Prize that they have won for any reason or the ECB determines that a Winner has breached these T&Cs, the ECB shall make reasonable efforts to contact the Winner but, if the Winner cannot be contacted, then the ECB reserves the right to offer the Prize to another Entrant. The ECB does not accept any responsibility for failure by any Winner to claim their Prize.
16. Each Prize will be sent to the Winner (or their parent or guardian) by email within thirty (30) days of being notified of their win. The Winner will not be liable for any costs related to shipping.
17. The Prize is non-exchangeable, non-transferable and no cash alternative is offered. The Prize may also not be sold by the Winner or passed on to another individual (e.g. in the case of tickets). The Prize does not include anything not expressly set out in these T&Cs including spending money, food and drink, associated travel and accommodation, medical or other general expenses. In the case of tickets that are awarded as the Prize, they shall also be subject to the applicable ticketing terms and conditions and any applicable ground rules at the venue where the fixture or experience is held. If relevant, the Winner will be responsible for ensuring that they and any person travelling with them are available to travel and hold valid passports, any necessary visas and travel documents on the relevant dates. The ECB shall not be responsible if the Winner is unable to take up the Prize for such reasons.
18. The Prize shall always be subject to availability, and the ECB reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to substitute any Prize for an alternative prize of commensurate value, if necessary.
19. The Winner may be contacted to participate in publicity related to the Competition, but participation is optional. If the Winner agrees to participate in any such publicity activities, the Winner and their guest (or if the Winner is under 18 years of age, their parent or guardian) agree that the ECB may, with prior consent of the Winner and their guest (or, as relevant, their parent or guardian), record, film and/or photograph their participation in all aspects of the relevant Prize and exploit, and authorise third parties to exploit, such films, photographs or recordings in any media now known or hereafter invented in any part of the world and for any purpose whatsoever

in perpetuity, with no payment being due. The ECB will, in due time, provide the Winner with all relevant information regarding this specific processing of personal data and request consent from the Winner before implementing said processing. Where the Winner is under 18 years old, the consent of their parent or guardian will always be sought in respect of any publicity.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

20. Neither the ECB nor any of its partners, affiliates, agents, employees, officers, directors or representatives will be liable (to the fullest extent permitted by law) for any direct, indirect or consequential loss or damage arising out of the organising or holding of the Competition or as a result of any Entrant's participation in the Competition or as a result of winning, collecting, use or enjoyment of any Prize, if the Competition does not run as planned or if any part of any Prize is unable to be delivered for any technical or other reasons. Entrants' statutory rights shall not be affected.
21. If the Competition or any part of it is not capable of running or being completed as planned for any reason, including but not limited to reasons of infection by computer virus, bugs, tampering, unauthorised intervention, technical failures or any other causes beyond the control of the ECB, the ECB reserves the right to cancel, terminate, modify or suspend the Competition without liability.
22. The ECB accepts no responsibility for Competition entries that are not successfully completed or submitted, regardless of cause, including (without limitation) due to a technical fault, technical malfunction, computer hardware or software failure, satellite, network or server failure, of any kind.

ENTRANTS' PERSONAL DATA

23. Any personal data relating to any individual which is received by the ECB in relation to the Competition will be used in accordance with applicable UK data protection legislation and the ECB's Privacy Policy, which can be found at: www.thehundred.com/privacy.
24. The ECB must either publish or make available information that indicates a valid award took place for a Prize. To comply with this obligation, the ECB will send the surname of the Winner to anyone who emails support@thehundred.com within one month after the Closing Date. If you object to your surname being published or made available, please contact the ECB. However, the ECB must still provide this information in accordance with applicable laws when requested. In such circumstances, the ECB must still provide the information to the Advertising Standards Authority on request.
25. If an Entrant has any questions about these T&Cs, including any request to exercise their legal rights under data protection law, they should contact the ECB at privacy@ecb.co.uk.
26. You will have the option to opt in to receive marketing emails from the ECB. If you do not opt in, the ECB will only contact you in connection with the organisation or administration of the Competition, including if you are selected as a winner in order to facilitate fulfilment of the Prize. If you choose to opt in, your information shall be securely stored in accordance with the ECB's Privacy Policy (as set out above). You have the option to unsubscribe from marketing emails at any time.
27. The Winner may be contacted to participate in publicity related to the Competition, but participation is optional. If the Winner agrees to participate in any such publicity activities, the Winner agrees that the ECB may, with prior consent of the Winner, record, film and/or photograph

their participation in all aspects of the relevant Prize and exploit, and authorise third parties to exploit, such films, photographs or recordings in any media now known or hereafter invented in any part of the world and for any purpose whatsoever in perpetuity, with no payment being due. The ECB will, in due time, provide the Winner with all relevant information regarding this specific processing of personal data and request consent from the Winner before implementing said processing

GENERAL

28. The ECB reserves the right to refuse entry to the Competition, to disqualify from the Competition or to refuse to award the Prize to anyone who it reasonably considers has breached these T&Cs or to anyone who, in the ECB's sole opinion, has otherwise acted improperly or dishonestly.
29. The decision of the ECB regarding any aspect of the Competition is final and binding (including as to the award of the Prize) and no correspondence will be entered into regarding any such decision.
30. If any provision of these T&Cs is found to be invalid by any court having competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of that provision will not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of these T&Cs, which shall remain in full force and effect.
31. These T&Cs and any dispute or claim (including any non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of or in connection with them will be governed by and construed in accordance with English law and all Entrants submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts in relation to any disputes or claims arising out of, or in connection with, these T&Cs or the Competition.
